



MINUTES OF THE BUSINESS MEETING
Held November 2, 2021

The November 2, 2021 Business Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m., by President Grubenhoff. The meeting was held at the Port of Sunnyside's Administration Office located at: 2640 E. Edison Avenue, Ste. 1, Sunnyside, WA.

Rate Hearing was opened at 10:01 a.m. by President Grubenhoff.

Legal Comments:

Rob provided an overview of the hearing. He explained that the purpose of the hearing will be to review and consider financial data and wastewater treatment cost projections for 2022, and to receive comments and information from current users of the Port's Industrial Wastewater Treatment Facility ("IWWTF") as well as any member of the public. As of meeting time there were no written or oral comments that had been received by Port staff. The Port's obligations with regards to this rate hearing are established by the User Contracts with the industries discharging their industrial wastewater to the Port. However, the old Industry Contract and the new User Contract have similar obligations as to this rate hearing, so it does not matter which contract form an industry has signed. Pursuant to the User Contracts, before establishing the IWWTF rates, the Port must send written notice to each industry.

1. The notice must be given at least 10 days before the public hearing. Here, the notice was mailed to the industries on October 13, 2020, and the public hearing is on November 2, 2021.
2. The notice must include the date and time of the rate hearing, together with any proposed rate changes. The letter that was sent out to the industries on October 13, 2021 included all of the information.
3. The Port must provide the industries with historic accounting data and other pertinent information to explain or support the proposed rate changes. The Port provided the 5-year historic data for each industry with 5 years of data at the user meeting held on October 12, 2021 and such information was also emailed to all industries before the user meeting.

Karen shared that notices regarding the hearing as well as copies of the rates had been mailed to each industry at least 10 days prior to today's meeting. The notices included the date and time of today's hearing along with the new proposed rates for 2022 and historical data for the IWWTF.

After all items had been discussed there were no further questions or comments.

The public rate hearing was closed at 10:14 a.m. by President Grubenhoff.

- Motion to approve Resolution 2021-10, "A Resolution of the Port Commission of the Port of Sunnyside setting 2022 Wastewater Rates for the Industrial Wastewater Treatment Facility. Commissioner Martin moved to approve; Commissioner Schilperoort seconded. Motion approved 3-0.
- Motion to approve Resolution 2021-11, "A Resolution Adopting a Budget for the Calendar Year 2022." Commissioner Schilperoort moved to approve; Commissioner Martin seconded. Motion approved 3-0.
